

PROGRAMS

During the Spring, Fall and Winter months, we have 4 programs running in the afternoons at Choices. These programs are open to any youth from the community. Contact Choices for more information

Mondays 4pm-5pm Life Skills/Anger Management alternating.

Life Skills encourages youth to acquire everyday skills that can be utilized as they become more self-sufficient; become aware about topics they know little about; or just reinforce basic skills they may already have but do not use often.



Anger Management

Provides youth tools to deal with their anger in a positive way. Knowing what triggers their anger and being able to recognize their own body cues, can assist them to turn their anger into positive release, rather than a negative outcome.



Tuesdays 4pm-5pm Art Therapy

This program gives youth the chance to express their feelings through creative art and is especially helpful to youth who have a hard time expressing themselves verbally.



Wednesdays 3:30pm-5pm Food & You

This program assists youth with shopping on a budget, help with finding food resources in Dufferin County, and assist youth with cooking meals when working on a tight budget.



This great Program was designed to educate youth about nutrition, overall health, budgeting, preparing meals, and how to shop properly. Based on attendance participants will be eligible to receive gift cards upon completion of the program to go and try out shopping nutritionally on their own. Food handling Certification is also available with this program.
